Meet Kevin Cysyk. Kevin is the current Chair of the Board of Directors for Pappus House. Initially, Kevin heard about Pappus House at an Uptown Rotary Club meeting. He was asked to join the board in 2022 and was later appointed board chair in January 2024. As you will see, Kevin has a passion and deep commitment for “helping” and making a difference especially for those in senior living facilities. So, Pappus House was a natural fit for him.

Kevin grew up in Forest Hill, Maryland. While he was in college he began working weekends at Rock Spring Village, a senior living facility in Forest Hill.

After graduating from Millersville University with a degree in business, Kevin was hired as a program director at Arden Court in Towson. He went on to work for them in both sales and marketing and helped to establish their stand-alone memory care community. At age 27, he returned to Rock Spring Village as executive director.
